

In your serving bowl, layer the grape mixture with brown sugar mixture.

DANCE YOUR WAY TO A BETTER LIFE

- Cardiovascular Fitness Dancing, (Round, Contra/Traditional or Square Dance), is a safe way to exercise. The moves are interesting, but the level of exertion is up to each participant. Rev up for a high intensity workout or take it slow and easy for a relaxing, yet beneficial workout. Dancing regularly can lead to a slower heart rate, lower blood pressure and an improved cholesterol profile
- Healthy Environment Square Dancing clubs are smoke and alcohol free.
 This allows the participants to concentrate on the calls and socialize in a safe environment.
- <u>Body & Brain Boost</u> Square, Round and Contra/Traditional dancers react to the calls as they are given. This forces the body and brain to be tightly coordinated. A number of calls are memorized which helps keep the mind sharp.
- <u>Calorie Burn</u> Dancing burns between 200 and 400 calories in thirty minutes of dancing. That's equivalent to walking, swimming or riding a bike.
- <u>Distance</u> The President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports recommends 10,000 steps per day to maintain physical fitness. It is estimated that a typical dancer can expect to clock 9,000 to 10,000 steps per dance.
- <u>Sturdy Bones</u> The side-to-side movements of dancing strengthen weightbearing bones, and help prevent and slow the loss of bone mass.
- Rehabilitation Square Dancing is a great way to get back in the swing of things if you are recovering from an injury. Dancing keeps your joints moving, and is a nice alternative to jogging or other high-intensity activities.
- Social Aspects You never know who you're going to meet on the dance floor. Some types of dance, such as Contra, require you to switch partners every dance, so it's very easy to make friends. Lifetime friendships are formed and some even meet the love of their life. There are dancing groups for everybody - Handicapable people, gay and lesbian groups, youth, singles and married couples.

Guess who's 65?

August 9th is the Smokey Bear and this year a recognized symbol of con-America's forests. His mestion has helped to reduce the

burned annually from approximately 22 million in 1944 to an average of 7 million today.

Smokey Bear is the center of the longest-running public service advertising campaign in U.S. history. Since 1944, he has been communicating his well-known message, "Only You Can Prevent Forest Fires." In 2001, the term 'Wildfires" was introduced to include all unwanted unplanned fires in natural areas such as grass fires or brush fires. The Smokey Bear campaign is a critical tool specially designed to ask for every citizen's conscientious commitment to be responsible with fire.



The living symbol of Smokey Bear was an American black bear who in the spring of 1950 was caught in the Capitan Gap fire, a wildfire that burned 17,000 acres in the Capitan Mountains of New Mexico. The cub was in the Lincoln National Forest. Smokey had climbed a tree to escape the blaze, but his paws and hind legs had been burned. He was rescued by a game warden after the fire.

At first he was called Hotfoot Teddy, but was later renamed Smokey, after the mascot. A local rancher who had been helping fight the fire took the cub home with him, but he needed veterinary aid. The cub was taken to Santa Fe when he was cared for by the family of Ray Bell, a New Mexico Department of Game and Fish Ranger. The story was picked up by the national news services and Smokey became an instant celebrity. He and the Bells were featured in Life, cementing his star status. Soon after, Smokey was flown to the National Zoo in Washington, DC, where he lived for 26 years. Upon his death on November 9, 1976, Smokey's remains were returned by

the government to Capitan, New Mexico, and buried at what is now the Smokey Bear Historical Park.

Smokey the Bear has been a staple in popular culture throughout the years. His lessons of preventing forest fires has stuck with many people as they have grown up. Lessons, they themselves will pass on. His message is as critical today as it was when Smokey Bear was introduced in 1944.


