



Camping Lessons Learned

Part 1 - Oct 14, 2011

As Pat & I finish our last year as NSDCA Board Members, it seems appropriate to share some of the "Life Lessons" we have learned in our years of camping while members of the NSDCA organization. Pat & I joined NSDCA in 1985. However my camping experiences started many years earlier with my first marriage to a daughter of a Winnebago Cabinet Setter/RV Delivery Driver.

My first campout was sometime in the early 1960's when I was in the Military. I could not understand then how people who didn't like living within 200 feet of a neighbor could enjoy parking as close as 10 feet from another RV trailer and have so much fun watching wood burn in a fire ring while meeting the neighbors. Later I have seem campers park so that they could butt their awnings together. That is friendly camping and we have been known to do the very same thing. The first thing I was taught by my father-in-law was the proper way to empty the holding tanks.

Life Lesson #1 was that black water is drained first and then the gray water. Fresh water is used to flush the drain hose. It then was then shook or swung around to get as much of the residual water out as possible before placing drain hose in the square steel bumper. I never forgot that, however, when Pat & I owned our first trailer it was not uncommon for the drain hose to start leaking as the bumper got rusty and the vibration, during travel, would wear spots in the hose. Gees, how many new hoses I bought during the first years.

Later I watch a travel friend squeeze his hose like an accordion, starting from the inlet to the outlet end. When he got to the last 6 inches or so it seemed like he got about ½ cup or more of water out of it. By using that method I don't think I have had to buy more than 3 hoses in the last 20 years.

Another lesson came on my first campout with my local chapter. A square dance friend that I had known for over 15 years came over to welcome me to the chapter. He said "Herman, I see you have designed your own water heater." This puzzled me as all I had done was hook the hose to the trailer and then pulled enough out of the coiled pile to connect the hydrant. He said that the sun would heat the water enough that it would still be hot that evening. "We place the excess hose under the trailer to keep it cool. Now some would say that this was a harsh way to tell me BUT I never forgot that lesson.

At an International Camporee in Sussex County, NJ the lesson learned by observation from someone else's bad luck, was why you put the pressure regulator at the hydrant end instead of the RV inlet. Instead of protecting just the RV pipes one protects the hose in hot weather when the hose gets very soft and weak.

All of us could share our learning experiences with the beginning campers and we all would benefit. Maybe the Editor will allow a "Letters to the Editor" type column where we can swap lessons etc.
