## NSDCA Vice Presidents

Jerry and Donna started square dancing when they retired to Florida in 2005. They were members of the Grand Squares in Gainesville, Florida and the Tri-County Squares in Trenton, Florida. While members of these clubs, they served in all capacities. In addition, Jerry and Donna dance A1 \& A2 with the Mixed Nuts in Gainesville. They have also taken up Round Dancing.

They were elected to the Northeast Florida Square and Round Dancers Association Board of Directors and served as Treasurer of the Association for three years. They were appointed as delegates from NEFSARDA to the Florida Federation of square dancers. The Robey's were honored by being selected by NEFSARDA as the Dance Couple of the year in 2010.

They are lifetime members of the Grand Squares Incorporated.
In 2008, they combined their love of square and round dancing and camping by joining the Square Wheels (chapter 128) in Florida. In 2012, they served as assistant chairmen of the Florida State Camp-o-ree, and in 2013 served as the chairmen of the Florida State Camp-o-ree sponsored by the Florida Association of the National Square Dance Campers.

A major involvement in the world of square dancing has been through the United Square Dancers of America. In 2009 and 2010, they were appointed as delegates from Florida to USDA. During that time they participated in the USDA - USA Travelers program and danced in all 50 states. In 2011, they were elected as Vice Presidents of the Central Region of the United Square Dancers of America, and are currently serving their third term in that capacity. While traveling the country for USDA, they decided to participate in the USA Travelers program once again as "Second Time Around" dancers. As of this writing, they have danced in 33 states, the second time around.

The Robey's have attended the National Square Dance Conventions each year since 2006, and have attended the State Conventions in 11 of the 12 states in the central region of the USA. They also have attended two International NSDCA camp-o-rees, and were pleased to have been elected to the NSDCA Board of Directors as the Vice Presidents at the camp-o-ree in Goshen, IN in 2013.

Jerry is a retired United Methodist Minister and Health Care Administrator and Donna is a homemaker. They have 5 adult children and 8 grandchildren plus 1 great grand daughter.
The Robey's have recently moved back to Illinois to be closer to their family in Rockford, IL. In Illinois, they will become members of the Blackhawk Cross Trailers (chapter 014).
