





The Hog Valley Christmas parade was bigger and better than last year. There were floats, motorcycles, candy flying all over, and even dog treats (Scarlett, a member's dog, was happy). Ron Imus had the fire going the entire campout, and we needed it – the temperatures at night were cold! There was no Christmas dinner this year due to the virus, but we all had our own special dish; it was different, but safe.

The Roadrunners (#193) campout at Highland Hammock State Park did Christmas in January; you can never get enough Christmas! We decorated and had a goofy gift exchange. The hall was closed for dancing, so we went to the 1st United Methodist Church and very carefully danced with gloves, sanitizer and whatever it took to be safe. Of course, getting vaccinated is not a guarantee that you won't fall ill, but if that occurs then hopefully the symptoms will be greatly diminished. Unfortunately, the vaccine does not preclude you from still being a virus-spreader, so social distancing and other preventative measures (like wearing a mask while out in public) still need to be followed.

In spite of the fact that the virus is still rearing its ugly head, the square dancing scene in several areas of the country seem to be slowly returning from a state of morbidity to one that is slightly active. My NSDCA chapter has been camping and dancing for a few months, even though the number of attendees is way down from past participation. Other chapters around the country are also dancing, and if not that, at least getting together to socialize. I know we all have our favorites, so please consider sharing (at least) one. And speaking of a lack of contributions, I've only had one chapter submit information for an article on their caller or cuer (see the writeup in Volume 58 Issue 4). One of the things I like the most about this newsletter is reading about what other chapters and their members are doing. This includes those people that allow our camping experience to occur, the callers and cuers. Caller and cuer names are often mentioned, but unless you are a member of that particular chapter or have had the opportunity to dance to them, you know nothing else about their background. On our travels around the country, we've danced with a several clubs and have enjoyed their fellowship and their callers. Let's extend your callers and cuers celebrity beyond their local area and let everyone know just how great they are. I've included a suggested list of questions to ask (that previously went out by email) on page 57 of this issue.

As always, please feel free to submit your camping schedules as soon as they are finalized or if there is a revision; there is no need to wait until the deadline for a new issue of the *TIMES*. I know many plans are still in a state of flux due to ongoing changes with government-mandated rules for social-gathering events, but when a date changes (whether an addition or cancellation) let me know and the online version will be quickly updated to reflect the modification.

Finally, when communicating with me – whether for the "chats", camping schedules, obituaries, lost camper contest or something else, please be sure to identify your chapter in the subject line of the email; this makes it easier for me to sort things out when assembling the newsletter. Also include the name of the person writing/submitting any article/camping schedule/obituary and their contact information (email and/ or phone number). I sometimes have to follow-up with what is submitted.

#### **Helpful Hints: RV Recall Information**

All commercially produced recreational vehicles, like automobiles, are subject to safety recalls. The RV, whether self-powered or towed, is a complex system of various manufacturer's equipment. We've had RV recalls for the air conditioner/heater thermostat and the fire extinguisher. So, how do you find out about these safety issues?

First, be sure your RV is registered with the manufacturer and they have current contact information for you. The RV dealer typically sends this information to the manufacturer when you buy a new unit, but if you buy your RV second-hand this transfer of information will not automatically occur; you must contact customer support and find out the process to ensure your information is properly logged.

Second, there are several websites you can check, although this must be done on a periodic basis. The RV manufacturer typically has a list of all the recalls on various models on their website. The US government also provides this information, although it is not always easy to find what is applicable to your unit. Sites to check are recalls.gov and nhtsa.gov. The first site listed does not provide specific recalls per se, but provides a link to search for vehicle, tire and other types of recalls; in other words, it acts as a front end to nhtsa.gov, where you will find specifics on recalls. The nhtsa.gov site allows you to search by VIN, vehicle type, tire or equipment, but searching keywords can be tricky – so be patient and try lots of variations if at first you are not successful. Another website to obtain RV-specific recall information is run by the private RV Safety and Education Foundation, rvsef.com. Look for "RV Recalls" under the 'About' drop-down menu on the top banner. Recognize the recall list on rvsef.com only lists some recent recalls and is not all-inclusive, but there is also a significant amount of general information available that should be useful for the new and experienced RVer on this website.



#### Feedback from Readers

Regarding the article on page 49 in Volume 59 #1 "An Inexpensive Home Freezer Monitor," Bill Baker (#123) had this suggestion:

I enjoyed your simple trick to know if your freezer was working while you are gone. I have a simpler one that shows failure or partial failure.

In a clear plastic glass, freeze water most of the way up in glass. After frozen, place a quarter on top of the ice. When you return, look at the quarter. If on top, no problems; if partially down the glass but still not to the bottom, your freezer was off for a period of time but did not fully thaw; and if the quarter is on the bottom, the freezer fully thawed.

#### **Sweet Creamed Corn Bread**

#### Ingredients:

1 can (14.75 oz.) cream-style corn

3/4 cup yellow corn meal

1 large egg

1 cup all-purpose flour

2 Tbsp. vegetable oil or melted butter

1/2 cup sour cream

1/2 cup milk

1/3 cup sugar

3 tsp. baking powder



#### Steps

- 1) Pre-heat oven to 425°F.
- 2) Grease a 9" square pan/casserole dish (or larger) and set aside.
- 3) Combine flour, corn meal, sugar and baking powder in a mediumsized bowl.
- 4) Whisk together milk, sour cream, egg, creamed corn and oil/butter in a second (small-sized) bowl.
- 5) Fold wet ingredients into dry ingredients until well combined.
- 6) Pour batter into prepared pan.
- 7) Bake for 30 minutes or until set and golden brown on top.
- 8) Cool slightly before cutting into squares.

## Two Big Mistakes

A recent RV email newsletter I subscribe to warned of "2 Big RV Mistakes You Might Be Making." These potential pitfalls are: 1) not having roadside assistance and 2) not using a tire pressure monitoring system (TMPS). This past fall I had need of both of these, and fortunately I had them.

We were traveling on Veterans Day en route to visit family in New York state, headed home to Florida from Maine, when our TPMS alarmed. I quickly pulled over to the side of the road, and while there was no visible damage to the identified tire, a quick pressure check with a gauge indicated it had lost about 10 psi. I was fortunate that the tire did not suffer tread separation; that could have caused significant damage to the trailer. Without the TPMS I would not have known there was a problem, thus tread separation more than likely would have occurred (see the image on page 38 of V58#4 for an example of a damaged tire that could rip out your trailer's wheel well and cause other damage).

I had checked the pressure of all the tires before we departed that morning, including the spare, so I was comfortable in my ability to somewhat quickly change out the damaged tire for the spare. And of course, I had the proper tools to change the tire, or so I thought! However, the lug nuts were on so tight I was unable to break them loose, even with the assistance of my torque wrench. Thus the need arose to use our roadside assistance plan. We were located on a back country road with little traffic, miles from the nearest bastion of civilization. The weather was relatively inclement, the temperature was dropping like a rock, and the sun was about to set, but we were safely off the road on a paved shoulder with our emergency flashers alerting anyone who happened by. One of our cell phones was able to pick up a signal, albeit a weak one. After navigating through the myriad of menu options, we had a challenge getting the roadside assistance operator to understand our predicament (continually asking if we needed a tow) and eventually a truck showed up with a very able driver who quickly changed the damaged tire out for our spare. An hour later (and five hours behind schedule) we arrived at our destination. Before we left town two days later, we put four new tires on the trailer (to be on the safe side) and were once again on our way back home, fortunately without further tire -related issues.

A good TPMS setup and roadside assistance plan are, in the long view, reasonably cheap insurance; I'm glad we had ours. Look for columns on these topics in a future issue of the *TIMES*.
