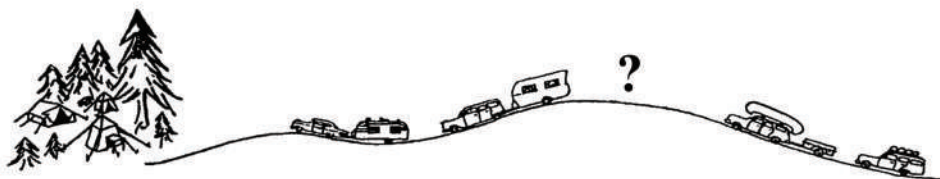

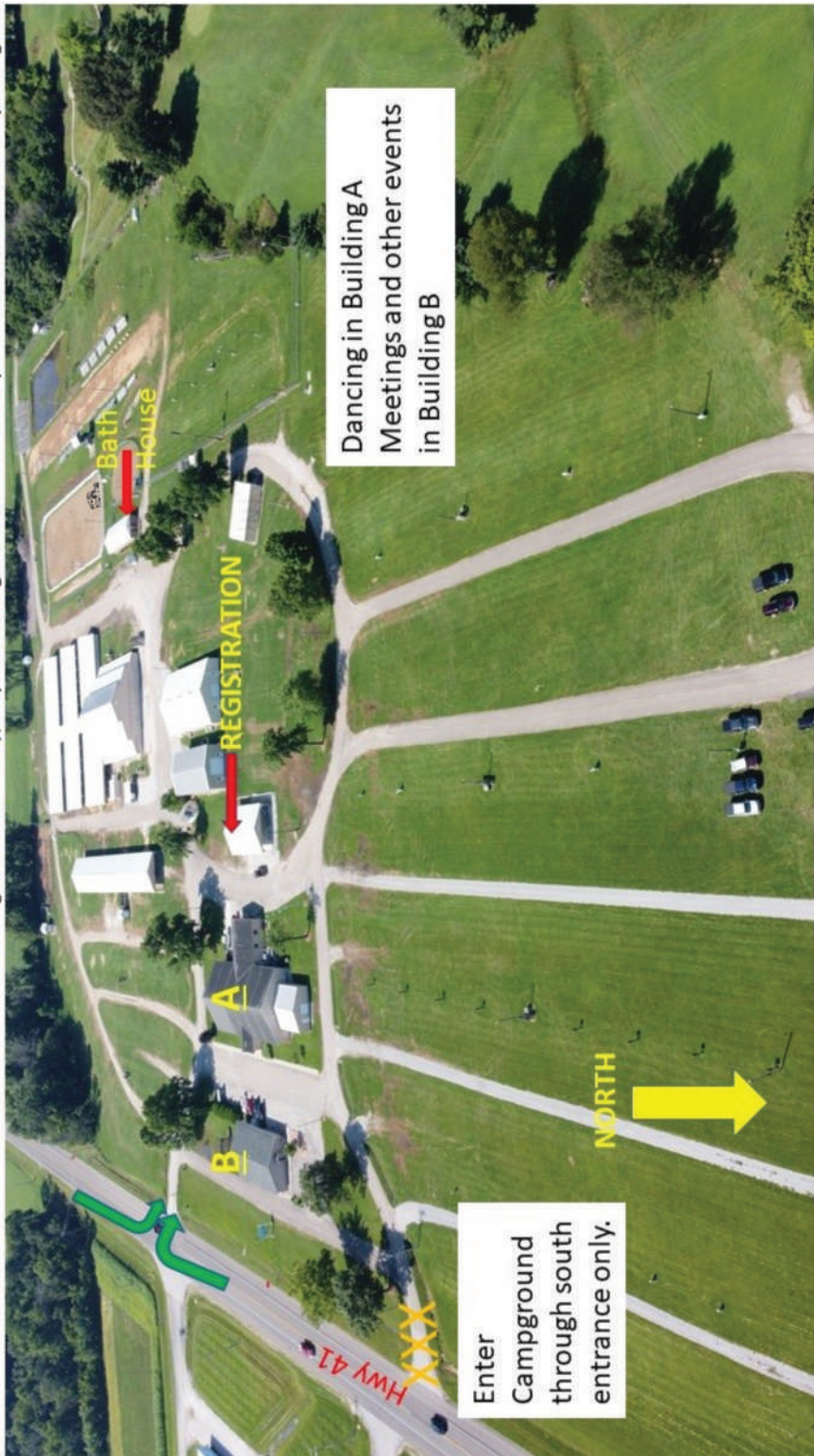

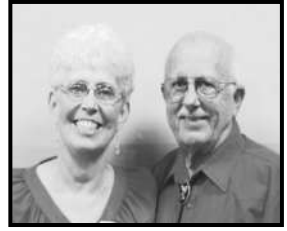

- 1) Please get your renewals in by the end of the year. It really makes our jobs easier and it ensures that your Membership stays active.
- 2) When submitting your renewals, make sure to use the correct form from the nsdca.org website, check all your members' addresses and email information and send changes along with the renewal. I have found a lot of emails that are incorrect and I am then unable to contact you when needed.
- 3) Submitting your renewals as a chapter also helps us maintain your information better. It is hard to know if you have members that are not renewing or just didn't get their information in on time. If you know there are members not renewing, please attach a note to the renewals.
- 4) If you know you are going to be living at a different address during the year, you can send me that information and your *TIMES* magazine can be mailed directly to you there. We use Bulk Mail to help reduce mailing costs, so the Post Office will not forward the *TIMES* to you; the *TIMES* magazine is returned to us and we have to pay an additional fee for this. I can send your *TIMES* to a different address for any 3 month period of March, April, and May, or June, July, and August, or September, October, and November, or December, January and February. You can contact me directly and we can set this up as soon as you know your location.
- 5) If you need new Membership listings, feel free to contact me and I will gladly send them to you.

NOTES FROM YOUR EDITOR



Our NSDCA webmaster, Bob Summers (C-175), is still tweaking our newly designed website. You hopefully have noted there's a new section under the Camping/Dancing Camporees menu item: State Camporees. Now, instead of having to search through the entire campout listing to find State or Province Camporees, they are conveniently grouped in one spot (but they still are included along with all the chapter campouts). Pennsylvania holds their State Camporee near the beginning of June, closely followed by the International NSDCA Camporee in Rockville, IN around the middle of June. Michigan holds their State Camporee towards the latter part of July, while Florida's State Camporee is towards the end of October.

Regarding the International Camporee, several chapters are holding campouts shortly before or after, so if your travels take you near one of these events, consider joining in. We have dropped in on other chapters' campouts and enjoyed good company, food and of course, dancing.

Our NSDCA website also provides links to individual chapter sites. There are only 11 links listed out of 50 chapters, or 22%. One of my web-savvy students told me about Google's Blogspot (www.blogspot.com), showed me the basics, and I was off and running; I stuck to the basics, but you can get fancy if desired. If anyone wishes to build a website for their chapter, please email me and I will send you instructions using Google's Blogspot. Once you get your chapter's website up and running, be sure to let me know the URL (i.e., the <https://> information) so we can get it posted to our Association's website so others can find out about other events your chapter might host.

Lastly, several recent campouts have either been canceled or the location has moved for one reason or another. Please let me know when this occurs so the website can be updated; others may be planning to attend.

Have a safe journey wherever your travels take you. And be sure to visit other chapters' campouts when you are in their area.



Helpful Hints: RV Water Heater (Part 1)

Has your RV water heater ever stopped working? A spider or other insect may be the cause; if they get into the flame tube they can build a web or some other obstruction that can either block the flame tube or the gas orifice. This can result in several kinds of failure, or there may be another issue.

An RV water heater is a relatively simplistic device, and often troubleshooting is relatively easy if you understand the unit's basic operation. Covering everything that can go wrong with an RV water heater is beyond the scope of this article, but hopefully this brief overview will help you troubleshoot a few common and easily solved problems.

Disclaimer: Working with propane and electricity can be dangerous. Caution must be taken when performing this work. Servicing your RV water heater can be an easy Do-It-Yourself task; however, if you are not comfortable with any of the potential risks, have a professional do this for you.

There are two major categories of water heater used in an RV: those with tank reservoirs (typically six or ten gallons) and those that are "tankless". The tankless variety is fueled by propane which is used to produce a gas flame which heats the water, while the tank reservoir type heats water with either a propane gas flame or using a submerged electric element, which can either be used instead of the propane flame or simultaneously with it to heat the water faster. This article will focus on the tank reservoir type of water heater, which come in two varieties:

- **Manual Gas Valve:** The gas valve controlling the propane is activated by the RV user. The valve is accessed via a hatch on the outside of the RV and operates a standing pilot light (i.e., one which is on all the time) which has to be manually lit.
- **DSI (Direct Spark Ignition):** This is the most common type of water heater in modern RVs. These models allow the user to flip a switch (typically inside the RV) to ignite the water heater's propane burner; there is no standing pilot light.

There are three major RV manufacturers of tank reservoir water heaters: Suburban, Atwood and Dometic. The brands are similar in design and operation, although Suburban uses a sacrificial anode rod (attached to the drain plug, which should be replaced yearly) inside the tank to minimize tank corrosion, whereas Atwood and Dometic employ a different strategy.

Before you start to troubleshoot, I strongly suggest you visit the manufacturer's website and download a service manual (if available) specific to your model of water heater. If the manufacturer does not offer the service manual, it may be available on another site; do a Google search to see if it can be found. Follow their troubleshooting tips before attempting

NSDCA BLANKET LIABILITY INSURANCE

The NSDCA has had blanket liability insurance coverage for all its activities since August 1, 1975. We are currently buying insurance through the Lawley Vivacqua LLC Agency and are insured with the Atlantic Casualty Insurance Company.

This insurance is issued in the name of the association, all its affiliated chapters, and includes all officers and directors, of either the association or any chapter while it engages in any activity on behalf of their group. The limit of the liability is \$1,000,000.00 per incident (\$2,000,000 aggregate) for either bodily injury or property damage or both when NSDCA is negligent.

This is however **NOT accident insurance**. It covers only injury or damage caused **accident or negligence** of the NSDCA or its chapters in the course of their activity. It will not necessarily pay for any injury that might happen. It has to happen in such a way that NSDCA would be legally held responsible for the injury. The insurance company would investigate and defend a claim resulting from any accident, but the injured party will normally not receive a settlement unless it can be proven there was negligence or fault of the chapters or association.

The policy is issued on a comprehensive liability form that covers the activities of the NSDCA or its chapters. This includes campouts, meetings, social affairs or any other type of an event, all of which are automatically insured. Specific questions should be referred to the company agent through whom the insurance is written.

The application Forms for Insurance Certificates, are available from the NSDCA at www.nsdca.org. There is no charge for the 'Proof of Insurance' certificate and it may be obtained by contacting:

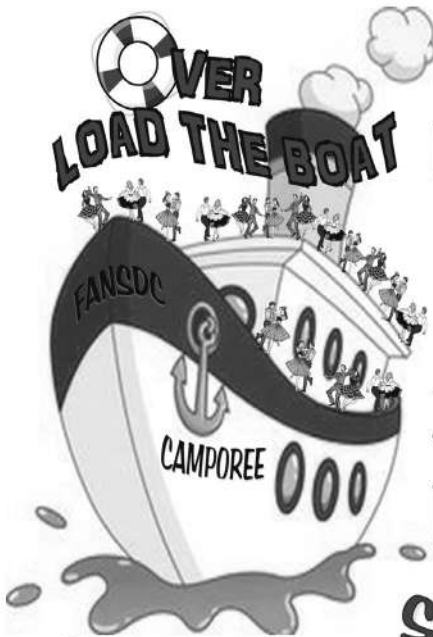

As we all get older, the certainty of an empty position in our squares becomes a recurring reality. We've shared good times, great dancing, wonderful food and hours of chats and laughter around flickering campfires. It's no surprise that we occasionally need to include some of those dear to us in this newsletter column.

Jayne Farr Blackwell Neary (#021, Rovin' Squares)

Jayne started in the music field during her school days by taking all kinds of dance lessons. She also studied piano, marimba, and violin. She danced solos at local dance recitals and performed on the marimba at churches, schools, hotels, and restaurants for local organizations. Jayne directed the children's choir at the Lawrenceville Presbyterian Church, which started with three children, and within three years 40 children were part of the program. She was also a tennis and bridge enthusiast.



In 1983, Jayne and her husband Jay became active in the square dance world. They were presidents of their club (#121, Rovin' Squares) and later held the office of president of the PA State Chapter of NSDCA from 2002 to 2005. They were PA State Representatives to the NSDCA for 15 years and visited all eight state clubs. Jayne and Jay traveled all over the United States in a motor home and for 15 years, wintered in Texas, and more recently they spent time in Lady Lake, FL. Jayne hopes you will remember her when you hear the sounds of a marimba or the voices of young children singing a church song. Jayne is survived by her husband of 65 years, two sons and daughters-in-law, and two grandchildren.

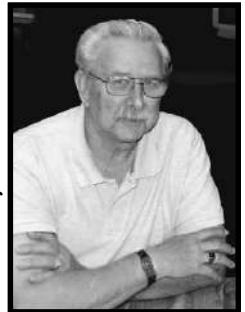
Ken Brasfield (#139, Limonaders)

They were delegates to the Florida Federation for many years. They received the Circle of Service Award in 1996 and the West Coast Association President's Choice Award in 2001.

number *and* where on the page our wayward campers are located. Simply providing something like "on the bottom of page 2" is insufficient; however, if you write something clever like the other contributors did, it gives a good indication you have properly located our lost campers, and you may get your answer published!

Be sure to include your Chapter's number and name regardless of the way you choose to communicate. Thank you.

the following.

Visually check for leakage around the water heater, inside the RV (you’ll probably have to remove an access panel) and outside the RV (via a metal access hatch). If there is water puddling by any fittings, you should come back to tighten them *after* you depressurize the system.

Next, carefully check the following to ensure the water heater is receiving the appropriate energy sources (again, do not attempt these steps if you are uncomfortable working with gas or electricity; leave the troubleshooting to a professional):

- **Propane:** Make sure your propane cylinders are turned on and other appliances (such as the stove) are operating correctly. Next, try to light the water heater; sniff or listen for any signs of propane coming through the gas valve. I strongly discourage verifying gas flow by “cracking” open the gas line where it enters the gas valve to check for propane escaping the gas line by smell, sound, or using soapy water sprayed on the fitting.
- **12 Volts DC** (aka house battery power): If you have a DSI water heater, use a voltmeter to verify 12 volts DC is reaching the water heater control board when the water heater switch is turned “on” (usually located inside the RV). A wiring schematic is usually found in the water heater owner’s manual or taped to the inside of the access hatch.
- If you have a DSI water heater, there should be a “thermal resistor” (really a heat-sensitive fuse) wired to (and standing somewhat above) the control board that resides inside the access hatch. The purpose of this thermal resistor is to turn off the burner in the event of a flame-back event, which is usually caused by an insect constructing an obstruction in the flame tube. This protects the control board’s electronics and kills the flame before it can catch any of the RV’s structure on fire. Verify continuity through the thermal resistor (i.e., ensure it has not “blown”) using an ohmmeter.
- **120 Volts AC** (aka shore power): If your water heater is equipped with an electric element, verify the switch that controls the electric element is turned on and 120 volts is present by safely using a voltmeter.

If the above items all check out with acceptable results, you can be reasonably assured your water heater problems are not due to water or energy supply issues. If one of the above items does not check out, see if the issue can be easily remedied (i.e., opening the valve on the LP tank, refilling an empty LP tank, or replacing a blown fuse for the 12V DC supply). If one of the other energy sources seems to be the problem, do the following *before* you start to service your RV hot water heater:

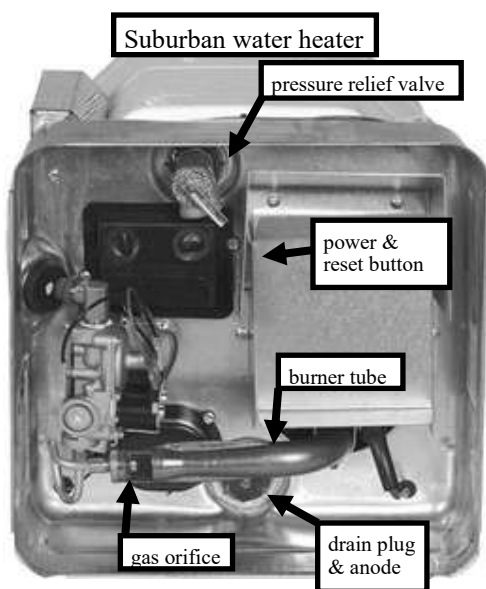

- Turn off the energy source (gas and/or electricity, 12V "house" power as well as the 120V "shore" power). Check your breaker box inside the RV; there should be fuses labeled for the 12V supply and a circuit breaker for the 120V supply. Verify there is no electricity at the water heater using a voltmeter.
- Turn off the water supply to the heater. The easiest way to do this is to turn off the shore water source (via faucet and hose) or turn off the RV's internal fresh water supply pump.
- Depressurize the system, as follows:
 - 1) Relieve pressure by opening a hot water faucet at a sink inside the RV or at an outside kitchen.
 - 2) Open the pressure relief valve on the water heater. It is often best to wear rubberized gloves and stand to the side when doing this.

At this point, if there was any indication of leakage around pipe fittings, gently tighten the fittings but be sure to not over-tighten or strip the threads.

If you didn't find a supply issue using the above steps, the next installment of this article will present some common problems with RV water heaters and ways to hopefully correct them.
