

It's now five weeks and counting to our next great NSDCA Camporee. This time it's in Lebanon, Tennessee, at the Wilson County Fairgrounds and is hosted by Chapter 198, the Tennessee Crossfire Campers. Are you ready for it? Are you registered? Are you coming? Are you excited? If you answered 'no' to any of my questions, then ask yourself why not? Then find answers to all your reasons for your NO responses (excuses) and plan to come and have a great time, a great summer with all your friends that will be there.

A little history about the NSDCA: It was started in the late 1950s by the Wolf River Callers Association in support of their friends, family and campers who also loved square dancing. The interest grew very rapidly with the first camporees (or group campouts) in the summer of 1958, 1959 and 1960 at Shawano Lake in Wisconsin. The NSDCA was formally incorporated on June 1, 1964 and Chapter 001, the Garden State Square Dance Campers (which is still active today) was formed with 17 charter families. Peak membership came in the 1980s and 1990s with about 5,000 member families, couples, or singles. Now in 2023, one year away from the 60th anniversary of Incorporation, or this year's 65th anniversary of the first Camporee, I'd like to invite you to reflect on where we are and consider the rich history of square dancing particularly through the fellowship of camping.

Our nation appears to be coming apart at the seams, pulled by forces of personal insistence on lifestyles and life choices never considered possible, probable, desirable, beneficial, valuable, honorable, and many more other "-ables" 60 years ago. We currently have approximately 400 member families and lose approximately 20% each year, not because of a lost interest in the activities and values that the NSDCA has been supporting, but simply because we're all getting older. Our membership is not being replenished by younger families whose interests in activities are drawn in many and varied directions.

So why do I raise all this? This year, our NSDCA International Camporee in Lebanon, TN will draw approximately 10% of our remaining membership. The work of hosting the Camporee is done by a very

We would like to again thank Mary & Dave Bruun for serving as the National Board Secretary for many years. Their time on the National Board is coming to the close in July 2023. Nominees are welcome to submit their profiles to the Board. Information about this process is on the NSDCA Website under 'Forms.' We welcome Tricia & Neal Chartier (#002) as Nominee for the Board of Directors.

We encourage all Chapters to support the PULL-TAB project as a fun way for all Chapters to compete for a great cause. There will be an additional prize for the Chapter which donates the largest volume of TABS at the 65th Camporee, although monetary donations will also be appreciated.

The 65th Camporee is well on its way and we have our 50th registration as of this writing. We urge everyone to send in their registration forms as soon as possible to assist in making sure there is enough of

While traveling back from Texas this year, we had several chances to stop to dance at local clubs or to talk to people about what NSDCA means and represents. One northern Texas square dance class also had three squares with a large graduation.

The point that I am working up to is this: it appears that there is an untapped group of people that are looking for something like square dancing to come back into their life. All of the people at the two campgrounds near my winter spot have an RV of some type, and some of the people in northern Texas also own RVs. They're prime targets for us. Pictured are antique themed wooden locks that actually work! Square Up Camper Jack Stone, a master wood craftsman, has a great hobby that is both rewarding and fun. The lock on the left is 5" tall and made of ash, walnut, red oak, white oak, cherry and walnut. The center lock is fash-



ioned with ash and walnut, after a train's box car lock from the 1800s. On the right is a combination lock like one from gym lockers, made of oak and walnut. His handmade locks now number more than 40; he began eight years ago after receiving a book from his son as a Christmas gift, written by a retired locksmith. Jack started working alongside his dad, who was a carpenter, at five years of age. He has had his own wood working shop at home since 2005 and also demonstrates traditional wooden bucket making at Lancaster's Living History Museum. He also creates "piggins" (a small wooden pail with one stave extended upward as a handle used centuries ago for hauling grain) and toys like a "gee-haw whammy diddle" associated with an Appalachian child's toy. 

Email users, beware!

There have been several attempts recently at luring unsuspecting NSDCA members into communicating via email with someone posing as our Association's president. You can be assured that whomever was doing this was only interested in their financial self-enrichment at your expense. Please do the following to ensure any email is officially from an NSDCA Board or Staff member:

- On most email platforms, placing the cursor over the sender's name or displayed email address (which actually could be different that where it originated) will reveal the entire email address. You should verify the address the email came from agrees with those published in the NSDCA *TIMES* for the appropriate person who the email claims to be the author. Many of the spoofed email addresses look legitimate, but on close examination will prove to have some difference from the correct one.
- Assuming the "FROM" email address is correct, after you click the REPLY button on your email program you then need to ensure your response is being sent back to the appropriate email address. A spoofer can make the "FROM" address you see when viewing the email prior to responding different than where the response is sent back to. Verify the response "TO" address is the same as the original "FROM" which you have already verified as being legitimate.
- If you have questions about the validity of the email, you can compose a separate email (using the address found in the *TIMES*) and write to the sender inquiring if the one you received is legitimate, or you could call them (phone numbers are often found in the *TIMES* as well).
- If the email is <u>not</u> legitimate, I suggest you mark it as "SPAM" using your email program's appropriate tool. This should prevent this particular spoofed email from coming through to your "INBOX" in the future (it will end up in your "SPAM" folder) but unfortunately the spammers are always subtly changing the email address they send from, so you should not let your guard down.

Please note that NSDCA Board and Staff members will <u>never</u> send an open-ended email asking you to 'reply when you are available,' nor will they request you to send them money. All members should pay their dues directly to and payable to their local chapter; the local chapter then writes one check from their chapter's checking account, payable to NSDCA for all of the members from whom they have collected dues. The History of Round Dancing with Square Dancing

Did you ever wonder how Round Dancing became associated with Square Dancing? My research indicates that 'couples dancing' has been happening at square dances since before the advent of what we know as Modern Western Square Dancing. During the dance couples would do rhythms such as waltz, polka, two step, varsouvianna, mazurka and Vien-

ese waltz either in a circle or amongst the squares. Of course, at that time there were no cuers; the dancers did patterns that they had memorized. A Round Dance may be anything that is not a Square Dance. They can be done solo, in couples, or in a group of dancers in a large circle.

Modern Western Square Dancing emerged around 1950 with the advent of recorded music and equipment on which to play it. As the number of Square Dance clubs exploded, Round Dancing also became more popular and the dances became more complicated. There were clubs that specialized in just Round Dancing. The cuers were ex-

specialized in just Round Dancing. The cuers were expected to be able to cue the dances from memory. Often times, the cuer would teach the dancers the first time through and then the dancers were expected to repeat it without cues. Most of the callers at that time were also round dance teachers. Now there are so many dances that cuers read the cues from a "cue card."



Modern Round Dances are groups of cues that are 16 to 32 measures in length which are repeated several times during a dance. The *Index of Rounds* found on the Roundalab website have 30,000 dances listed.

Squares and Rounds have been partners since the beginning of square dancing. So go out and learn round dances and increase your fun at the square dance!





Grapefruit Pie

Are you looking for a tasty, tangy treat to serve at afterparties? If so, this recipe may be just the one you've been waiting for!

Ingredients for Pie:

1-1/2 cups FRESH grapefruit juice


1/2 cup FRESH orange juice


1 cup sugar

3 egg yolks, beaten (save whites for the meringue)

Steps for Pie:

1) Mix above and cook on stovetop until good and hot.





3) Then mix into juice till it thickens.

4) Cool, then pour into a baked pie shell. (If you pour into pie shell before it cools, your crust will be soggy.)

Steps for Meringue:

- 1) Beat the 3 egg whites (saved from above) with a mixer, slowly adding 1/4 tsp cream of tartar and 3 Tbsp of sugar.
- 2) When finished (i.e., stiff) pour onto pie.
- 3) Let meringue brown in the oven at about 350 degrees.
- 4) Check every 5 minutes until brown.

Keep the pie refrigerated until use.

Makes about 8 servings: ~122 calories/serving.

GPS Search (part 1)

Do you recall the days when you'd navigate your travels with paper state and area maps you got at the gas station (for free!) or an atlas? These days your travels are typically directed with a dedicated GPS or phone-based routing app (e.g., Google Maps, Apple Maps or Waze). I'm not too fond of the phone-based apps as the quality of the maps is not great and the visible screen is small, but they do often give you a heads-up on traffic, so we often keep checking when approaching a big city or things seem to be clogging up on the Interstate.

Our truck has a built-in GPS, and a very nice one at that, but its database is vintage 2011 and it costs a small fortune (more than the price of a decent dedicated portable GPS) to update. We have been using it (typically for detailed maps versus navigation) in conjunction with a 7-inch portable dedicated GPS for directions. I also keep paper state and area maps on hand, as well as several atlases (two of my favorites are a trucker's atlas and a Michelin Road Atlas). Additionally, I usually print out (via web-based Google Maps, Good Sam Trip Planner or AAA TripTik® routing software) the route I intend for us to take. The GPS sometimes agrees with my planned route, but often it has other ideas (which I sometimes accept).

Recently, the dedicated portable GPS has started to show its age. The maps can no longer be updated (in spite of the manufacturer's 'lifetime' update guarantee) and the display screen has dropped a few rows of pixels, so it was time to start looking for a replacement. I wanted something on the order of the same size as we have been using, approximately 7-inches diagonally for viewing area, and that would accept the Good Sam Trip Planner's GPX file format the software can produce, so the GPS would finally follow the route I intended us to take. This limited me to units made by Garmin (all of our previous units have been Magellan).

I briefly entertained getting one of the RV-specific units, but the price put me off of that idea (there's no sense spending as much for a dedicated unit as to what would be the cost of a general-purpose computer). Looking around for online reviews, I stumbled on the Garmin DriveSmart 71EX, and while not stated in the owner's manual (which I downloaded to see its features) a quick chat with customer support indicated it does accept GPX files via Garmin's BaseCamp or Drive utilities. Another benefit: it was available at WalMart and cost considerably less that updating the truck's GPS database.

Part 2 will cover the things a GPS can do for you these days, the learning curve, and overall satisfaction level.


