

NOTES FROM YOUR EDITOR

It's been a year since some intrepid souls in our Chapter woke our caller at 2 a.m. and had him call an "Idiot" dance – much to our delight (and chagrin, ever



do a *beermug chain* when you really haven't woken up and can't think clearly?). That got me thinking – when I was a teenager my family square danced and camped (although to the best I can determine, not as part of the NSDCA). Afterparties were a family affair with lots of antics and opportunities to earn special badge bars. Some that I still managed to not lose through many moves and years are the "Turtle", "Aunt Fanny", "Crackpot", "Black Cat", "Stinker", "Pogo", "Mummy" and "Elevator". I earned my initial "Idiot" and "Purple Heart" at that time, too. Some of those bar names are self-explanatory and others I don't

have a clue – do you?

Maybe because there were so many youths involved at that time that afterparties were that way. Most afterparties these days are purely social affairs – there's nothing wrong with that – but some opportunities to dance in strange places (witness the "Crackpot" and "Elevator") might make for interesting conversation later and it will certainly provide a good time for all involved.

As I write this in the middle of January, our high temperature has hovered in the low to mid-80s, with overnight lows in the low-60s. If the weather forecasters are correct that is about to change, with highs in the low-50s and lows in the middle to low-30s. This being Florida, however, those kinds of temperatures usually don't last long. If we don't get a semi-prolonged freeze soon the mosquitoes are going to have a field day when they start hatching in the spring; actually, there are still plenty around to harass anyone who walks outdoors.

A list of questions for your Chapter Callers and Cuers has been distributed via the e-tree to

your individual Chapter contacts. I'm hoping to have an occasional column in the *TIMES* highlighting those people that help make our camping weekends possible. I recognize many Chapters are hibernating at present due to the local temperatures. What better a time to take care of this request so you won't have to worry about it when all the fun starts with the advent of warmer weather? I look forward to hearing from all



of the Chapters. You don't have to worry about trying to arrange your caller/cuer answers into a narrative — I'll take care of that. But I need those responses before I can do anything — so please make some time to get them answered. Thank you!

As previously mentioned, please feel free to submit your camping schedules as soon as they are finalized or if there is a revision; there is no need to wait until the deadline for a new issue of the *TIMES*. Our NSDCA webmaster, Dave Seay, is prompt about updating the scheduling information as he receives it from me, but I can't provide it to him unless I get it from you! And remember, as you are making your travel and dancing plans, be sure to check with the listed contact to ensure there haven't been any last-minute changes.

How to Keep Your RV Safe from Theft

- Get in the habit of always locking your doors. One of the easiest ways to deter thieves is to simply lock your doors anytime you leave, no matter how long you're going to be gone. Be sure to lock both the handle and the deadbolt; the handle is often keyed to a master for service work at the dealership, and a thief may have a copy of this key. Also make sure to close and lock exterior storage compartments.
- ◆ Shut the windows and close the blinds/curtains/shades when you're away. Not only does this dissuade thieves, but it also keeps the sun from shining in, which can cause fabric colors to fade.
- ◆ Hide expensive items, or just leave them at home. Before leaving your RV, hide valuables like your iPad/tablet, Kindle, laptop, cell phone, camera, or jewelry. Better yet, leave costly items at home. You may also want to invest in a safe for your irreplaceable items.
- ◆ Keep the interior lights on if you leave your RV after dark. With the interior lights on and your blinds/shades closed, criminals will have less of an idea if someone is inside. Exterior motion-detecting lights can also work as a deterrent.
- Befriend your neighboring RVers. Even if you're not staying in a
 park for long, start up a conversation with your neighbors. They can
 keep an extra set of eyes out and will know when someone does not belong.
- Put items away if you're leaving the campground. To eliminate temptation for thieves, put away or lock down your camping items prior to leaving your site, such as chairs, cooking equipment, or bicycles. Don't make it easy for the thieves to take your stuff.
- Upgrade your RV's locks. Most RVs come with a set of default keys from the factory. Consider having your door deadbolt locks rekeyed, but not the ones on the handle as they are typically mastered for maintenance. You could also swap these locks out for the keyless entry variety.





Proposed By-Laws Changes

A motion was made at the 2019 General Membership Meeting to correct Article XI, Section 4, dealing with the number of members required to form and maintain a chapter. A By-Laws Committee was appointed in accordance with Article VIII, Section 2, consisting of Mary Bruun (Secretary and current Board Member), Bill Wilcox (past Board Member), Park Bierbower (PA State Representative), and Donna Seay (Chapter Representative and who introduced the motion). This committee met during 2019 to consider the current text as shown below and proposed that the text be changed to that proposed. A motion will be entered by the Secretary at the 2020 General Membership Meeting to amend the NSDCA By-Laws accordingly.

Current Article XI, Section 4 Text:

- a) The number of members needed to form a chapter shall be determined by the Board of Directors.
- b) The minimum to retain a chapter shall be determined by the Board of Directors.

Proposed Article XI, Section 4 Text:

- a) A chapter per Article XI, Section 2 that is compliant with the conditions of Article III, Section 1 shall have a minimum of 8 adult members. A "probationary" chapter shall consist of 4 to 7 adult members who are otherwise compliant with the conditions of Article III, Section 1, may retain the "probationary" status for not more than 3 years. A probationary chapter shall not be chartered.
- b) If a probationary chapter fails to increase its membership to 8 members or more in 3 years following its formation, the chapter shall be disbanded, and its members shall be reclassified to MAL (Members At Large) status. The probationary term may be extended for one year on the recommendation of the Board or the corresponding State or Area Representative.
- c) As of the approval date of these amendments, a currently established chapter whose adult membership falls below the eightmember minimum of Article XI, Section 4. a), shall be exempt from the requirement and retain its charter.

In accordance with Article XIII, Section 1, a two-thirds (2/3) vote for the amendment from those in attendance is required for the motion to pass. Please consider the proposed amendment before your vote this summer.

Helpful Hints for your RV:

How much trailer can you safely tow?

The simple answer is, "It depends!"

What does it depend on? This discussion will stick to a truck used as a tow vehicle (TV) with a bumper-pull travel trailer (TT) versus a fifth wheel or using a Class A or C to pull a toad, but similar calculations could be made.

All trucks and trailers since late 2005 have had (by federal law, 49CFR575.6) a yellow sticker label on the driver's side providing tire type and pressure information as well as maximum payload. There is also a white sticker label (per 49CFR567.4) that provides (at a minimum) the manufacturer, VIN, gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR), gross axle weight rating (GAWR) and date of manufacture.

To determine if you are safely towing you need to know the following about your TV: GAWR, GVWR and payload (from the aforementioned labels), towing capacity (from the year-specific towing guide produced by the TV manufacturer) and GCWR (gross combined weight rating, obtained from the owner's manual; note you will probably need to know your rear axle differential ratio, which is listed in a code on the white sticker label). You also need to know the GVWR for your TT (from its white sticker label) and the TT's loaded hitch weight/tongue weight (preferably from a CAT scale weighing of your fully loaded TT; in lieu of that use 12.5% of the TT's GVWR – do not use the manufacturer-provided sales brochure value as it is based on dry weight – and you never travel with a trailer having this weight).

For bumper pull TTs, first ensure your TT's tongue weight can be handled by the class of the hitch receiver on the TV, found in the owner's manual. Note: you also need to verify you have a proper hitch and ball, but I'm assuming you are using (at a minimum) a load equalization/weight distribution hitch (WDH) properly sized and set up — either by you or by the RV dealer. I know it's hard to believe, but verifying the TV hitch receiver class is not often done by the RV dealer. In fact, I've noted too many overloaded TVs on the road; recently I was at a local RV dealer and someone drove out of their lot pulling a new 35-foot fifth wheel with a Ford F150, severely sagging in the rear. No, they don't use a bumper pull hitch receiver, but they were sold a TT with a pin weight in excess of what they should probably have, overloading their rear axle. The chart on the following page provides the various hitch classes (see https://www.curtmfg.com/types-trailer-hitches).

For the above chart: GTW = gross trailer weight (i.e., TT GVWR), the maximum weight of the trailer you can tow with the hitch; TW = the maximum tongue weight supported by the hitch; WD = using weight distribution, the maximum trailer GVWR; WDTW = using weight distribution, the maximum tongue weight.

Next, tongue weight plus <u>actual</u> payload (which should include the weight of the WDH assembly) should not exceed the payload value on the TV's yellow sticker label. The only way to verify the axle ratings are within limits is to get your fully loaded (meaning as you would normally travel) TV and TT weighed on a CAT scale (or equivalent). Note the curb weight of the TV is obtained by subtracting the stated maximum payload from the TV's GVWR; the curb weight typically includes a full load of fuel and a 150-pound driver with no passengers or other payload. When determining the TV's payload, don't forget all the other "stuff" you have in the cab and bed – it adds up!

Towing capacity is different than GCWR; towing capacity is the maximum weight of the TT you can tow (similar to the GTW or WDTW in the table above; this should be based on the TT's GVWR), whereas GCWR (from the owner's manual) is the maximum combined weight of the fully loaded TV and TT (which may be different than the sum of each vehicle's GVWR, but using the sum is conservative). Determining the TV's towing capacity is a little convoluted. First you need the TV's axle code (which specifies the your rear axle differential ratio, obtained from the white sticker label) and the TV manufacturer's year-specific towing guide (available online from the manufacturer's website); you use axle ratio, drive type (2WD or 4WD), the TV cab style (regular, extended or crew), bed type (standard, short or long), number of tires (single rear or dually) and engine values to locate the appropriate limit in a table in the towing guide. As previously stated, unless you have actual numbers from weighing the TT and TV (loaded as you would for normal camping use) use the TT's GVWR as the towing weight; always ignore the UVW (unloaded vehicle weight). The TT's GVWR should be less than or equal to the TV's towing capacity.

For a fifth wheel (versus a bumper pull) TT, the pin weight (about 12.5% to 15% of the TT's GVWR if a true value is not known) should be less than the rear axle's GAWR. Remember to include the weight of the hitch sitting in your TV's bed in your calculation of payload.

How much cushion should you have between your true weight of the TV/TT combination and the TV's GCWR? For my TV/TT combination, I typically travel with 21% or more margin to GCWR (verified by CAT scale weighing); fully loaded (maxed out GVWR on both vehicles, a condition I have yet to meet) yields 6% margin. The more margin you have, the safer you are. Of course you don't want to buy a TV much larger than is necessary, but having one with ample margin may provide 'room to grow' allowing you safely upgrade to a larger TT (without getting a new TV), it will save you money (not spent) on repairs from overstressed engines, transmissions and suspensions, and you won't have white-knuckle experiences while driving due to inadequate steering or braking control.

Here are some other factors to think about when towing:

- ✓ How you feel (tired, irritable, ...)
- ✓ Road surface condition
- ✓ Visibility
- ✓ Potential distractions
- ✓ Traffic
- ✓ Your own experience level towing similar loads
- ✓ Your experience with this towing rig
- ✓ TV condition
- ✓ Towing load relative to TV capacity
- ✓ TV load relative to capacity
- ✓ TV weight relative to trailer weight
- ✓ Type of TT
- ✓ TT front and side area
- ✓ Wind speed
- ✓ Wind direction

A side wind is more problematic than a head or tail wind, and a fifth wheel TT will be more stable than a bumper pull TT, even with an antisway WDH. Also, a heavy TV (regardless of capacity rating) relative to the TT will be more stable.

Always do your own due-diligence when determining an acceptable TV-TT combination – don't rely on a salesman; educate yourself and work the numbers. Safe travels!



Portuguese Vegetable Soup

Ingredients

1 chopped onion

3 (or more) stalks of celery (I really like celery!)

1 box of beef broth

1 large can of Old Glory mixed greens (that kicks it up a notch!)

1 large can of chopped tomatoes

2 large sweet potatoes, cut in chunks

(love the color it adds or use some carrots if you like)

1 can of black beans

1 or 2 zucchini or summer squash (in my case I use both)

Any kind of vegetable you need to clean out of your freezer!

1 package (contains 4 sausages) Quijote Chorizos Caseros

(The real secret to the Portuguese soup! I get it at Publix or Aldi's)

Steps 5

- 1) In a large pot, cook the onion and celery with a little olive oil until it makes the house smell good.
- 2) Take casings off the sausages, then slice them in pieces. Go for it! Use all four sausages.
- 3) Stir in the remaining ingredients.
- 4) Cook on medium-low for 20-25 minutes until the vegetables are al dente firmness.

The soup stores well and should be reheated over medium-low heat.

Serves twenty (makes about 5 quarts). ~192 calories/1 cup serving.
